



Vehicle Extrication Initial - 12 hrs.

2 - Year Refresher - 8 hrs.



Vehicle extrication is the process of removing a vehicle from around a person who has been involved in a motor vehicle accident, when conventional means of exit are impossible or inadvisable. A delicate approach is needed to minimize injury to the victim during the extrication. This operation is typically accomplished by using chocks and bracing for stabilization and hydraulic tools, including the Jaws of Life. Standards and regulations can be found in NFPA 1670 and 1006.

Host Responsibilities

- At least 2 vehicles for minimum 12 students. Additional vehicles may be required depending on number of students.
- Rehab (cases of water).
- Portable toilet or restroom.
- Minimum of 12 students, if not met, host organization(s) may be held responsible for the cost for the training including instructor fees, mileage, hotel, & incidentals.

Minimum Student Requirements

- Full PPE
- Students must be 18 years of age (minimum) to receive certification.
